Covid-19 Restriction Changes - 1st April 2022

As you will be aware new guidance came into force from 1^{st} April for the next steps of living with Covid-19. These means that testing will no longer be available to the majority of the population, although there may still be some families who have still got some lateral flow tests.

There was also an updated list of symptoms published which could mean that you could have covid-19. These are as follows:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhoea

Our school will be following the new guidance which is as follows:

- If you are feeling unwell with symptoms as above, please stay at home until you feel
 well enough to resume normal activities and no longer have a temperature. This
 applies to both adults and children.
- For adults testing positive for COVID-19 (some people will still have LFT kits available), they should stay at home for 5 days (remembering day 0 is day of onset of symptoms/day of test if no symptoms) and avoid contact with others. They should then return to normal activities only if well enough and don't have a temperature. For children testing positive for COVID-19 (under 18 years old), they should stay at home for 3 days and avoid contact with others. They should then return to school and normal activities only if well enough and don't have a temperature.

In school we will still be following the guidance about regular handwashing and Keeping all areas of the school well ventilated.



Year 2

What an extremely busy half term we have had! We have been so lucky to have lots of different opportunities to do exciting things. Our first two days back started with getting ready for the Mardi Gras celebrations, where we enjoyed lots of dancing, music playing and eating pancakes. We then quickly moved onto World Book day where we got to dress up as our favourite book character and do lots of reading and craft making. After the first week back, we moved onto to our brand new topic, 'Flight' We started our topic off by going on our own adventure to Disney Land! The Year 2 teachers, set up an aeroplane in our classroom for us to go on, but we had to check in first with our own passport and boarding pass. Before we set off we were very lucky to have a flight attendant, called Denise, who went over all of the safety elements that we needed to know whilst we were on our flight. After our exciting adventure to Disney land, we then came back to our classroom and started learning about Leonardo Da Vinci, who was a famous artist. We recreated his famous painting 'Dreams of Flying'. After that we then used the iPad to research about the first ever plane that went into the air. It was called 'The Flyer' and it was created by The Wright Brothers. However we discovered it only went into the air 4 times and the longest it stayed in the air for was 59 seconds. Once we had learnt about the first flight, we then compared The Flyer to a modern day aeroplane, exploring how much quicker, safer and larger than The Flyer they are. After that we then focused on Science by making our own Paper Helicopters. Our experiment started by us dropping our paper helicopters from different heights and environments. Then we created another helicopter that had alterations made to it to test whether smaller/thinner wings made a difference to how quickly the helicopter fell to the floor. On the very same day as making our helicopters we also had a fantastic visit from 'Sublime Science' who are a company who demonstrate lots of fantastic science investigations. We got to watch snow being made, a cup get dissolved and lava erupt from a volcano. However our favourite part was getting to make our very own slime that we got to play with in class!

Also to end the week, we went on a fantastic trip to RAF Cosford and all of the children were an absolute credit to Nathaniel Newton- every single child was brilliantly behaved and were all so interested in learning facts about the aeroplanes, missiles, tanks and so much more. However our favourite part has to be launching the rockets into the air—some even hit the roof!

We hope that you all have a very restful and wonderful Easter break and we hope that the Easter bunny brings you lots of lovely treats!








Year 1 NewsLetter

Progress in maths has been exciting as the children have begun to count in multiples of 2, 5 and 10 and relate it to the multiplication tables. The teaching staff are impressed by the quality of the children's stories, including their structure, the super sentences with punctuation and description, as well as the children's stamina for writing – they have written up to three A4 pages in length. 




Over the course of the last six weeks, the children have also developed their knowledge and understanding of England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland through our topic work on the **British Isles**. Here is a glimpse of some of the activities that have kept us very busy...

We have been studying maps of the British Isles and the children are proud to have created their own maps. They have used a key to identify land and sea and labelled the countries with their capital cities and displayed each countries flag on the map. At the very top of the map, the children have drawn a Union Jack to show the combination of the nation's flags.







The children have also been finding out about animals that live in the British Isles. They were able to distinguish between land and sea animals. Each class also worked hard to sort different creatures into carnivores, omnivores and herbivores.



Celebrate with Northern Ireland

To mark Saint Patrick's Day, we had our very own celebration in Year One! Dressed in green t-shirts for the afternoon, we discovered all about Saint Patrick and how he was a missionary in Ireland. We found out about Irish symbols and their meanings including the shamrock and the leprechaun. While we completed our activities, we enjoyed listening to some Irish music and had our own Irish Ceili! Some of our children were very good at dancing a jig and it caused us quite a giggle!




Focus on Wales...

We have been on a fact finding mission to discover information about England. The children worked collaboratively to answer questions such as: What is the capital city of England? Where does the Queen live? What is England's most popular sport? Can you name some foods that England is famous for? Do you know the name of any famous English people?



Other highlights over the course of the half term include...

World Maths Day - we had a whole morning of fun with numbers! Songs and singing, counting in different patterns, actions and movements, shapes, dot-to-dots, board games and ipads.



Sublime Science... we had a visit from Sublime Science for a workshop full of fun, learning and science vocabulary. It was brilliant and we laughed – A LOT! We observed and participated in lots of science experiments...lava erupting from a volcano, watched polystyrene dissolve, experimented with forces, and made our own snow and slime!







Music Day with Tim Scarborough

Year One children enjoyed a music workshop with Tim Scarborough and each experienced playing three instruments..the drum, the shakers and the bells. He taught us to play some different rhythms through a story all about Sammy the Spider.



Hooray for World Book Day! The children celebrated WBD and loved dressing up as a book character and sharing their favourite books. We took the opportunity to read lots of stories, enjoy craft activities and celebrate books!

Year R


