

Dear Parents/Carers,



For this edition of the newsletter I have decided to focus on **COVID-19** in order to provide everyone with some reminders, updates and clarifications. I appreciate that the majority of people will already know this information and although I do not wish to offend anyone, I am only trying to ensure we are all collectively working together to ensure everyone in our school community is kept as safe as possible.

- 1 Please arrive as close to your allotted time for drop off and pick up as possible to avoid unnecessary congestion at the top of the drive. Both Mrs Taroni and myself work hard on the gate to keep the flow of pedestrians as fluid as we can.
- 2. We ask that only one parent accesses the site to allow for social distancing. This sometimes means that we have additional adults waiting at the top of the drive again causing unnecessary congestion. Therefore, if it is absolutely necessary that two adults bring/collect their children to/from school, I would ask the adult not entering the site to wait away from the school either further down the road or across the road.
- 3. NO PARKING or STOPPING on the zig zag lines at any times. I, along with many parents, find it unbelievable that despite us putting cones out some parents still decide to ignore all these preventative measures to keep our children safe. We need to avoid any unnecessary congestion at the top of the drive to ensure we can appropriately social distance when arriving and leaving the school site. Please walk on the path through the small gate on the way down the to school and back up the driveway and through the big gate on the way out of school.
- 4. Please always adhere to social distancing and ensure your child remains with you at all times when on the school site. Children should not be playing on any equipment either at the start or the end of the school day. Warwickshire have circulated a poster (posted in this newsletter) to encourage parents to wear face masks on and around school sites.

Guidance around family members displaying symptoms


1. If anyone in your household displays any one of the top three symptoms: A new continuous or worsening cough A high temperature A loss of taste and smell <u>the whole household must self-isolate and the person with symptoms needs to get a test ASAP.</u>

- 2. When the test result is known if the test result is negative the members of the household can stop self isolating and we need to be informed by sending an message via the MyEd app. This should be done as soon as the test result is received even if this is in the evening or at the weekend.
- 3. If the result is positive you must ring school straightaway irrespective of the time it is. We are in the process of setting up an out of hours number which we will let you know as soon as possible by MyEd. Do not leave a message on the school answering machine. We will then get straight to work to contact Public Health who will advise us through the process of self-isolating contacts. Acting swiftly, we enable us to stop the spread quickly. The person with a confirmed case should self isolate for 10 days. If after 10 days they have been clear of a temperature for the last 48 hours they can end their isolation. Contacts of the confirmed case will need to self isolate for 14 days.
- 4. If a member of your household is identified as a close contact, it is only them that need to self-isolate and everyone else can go about their business as usual. If the household member then goes on to develop symptoms, then you need to follow the process from point 1 above.

I hope all of the above has been helpful and I wish to express my sincere thanks to all of the parents who have been supporting us while we navigate our way through changes to our school during this unprecedented time.

<u>Year 2</u>

Staff Training Days

As always thank-you for your support and understanding as we navigate our way through this unusual and unpredictable time.


