

Knights, Castles and Dragons Topic Fact Sheet

Castles are a type of home that were built to protect the people
inside. People who lived in the castle included rulers like lords and
kings, as well as soldiers who would defend it from enemy
invaders.
In the Middle Ages, knights were armoured soldiers who fought
for their lord or king.
A dragon is an imaginary animal that appears in stories. Dragons
often have scaly skin, sharp teeth, four legs with long claws, and a
long tail.
A shield is a piece of protective armour made from a tough
material. It is worn on a knights' forearm to protect them from
blows from hand weapons and missiles.

Armour was a protective item of clothing made of steel which
knights wore during battle.
The Middle Ages, or Medieval Times, in Europe was a long
period of history from 500 AD to 1500 AD. That's 1000 years!
A weapon that has a long blade, usually with a sharp point and
edge.
The battle took place on the 14 October 1066. It was fought
between William of Normandy and King Harold – the King of
England – and it was the English throne that was at stake.
A battle is a fight between two armed persons or forces during a
war.
A coat of arms is a unique design with symbols and figures
painted on a shield. These designs may be inherited, meaning that
they pass from a father to his children.
A lance is a weapon with a long handle and a sharp steel head
used by knights on horseback.
William the Conqueror was one of the most famous kings in
England's history. He won the Battle of Hastings with the help of
his massive army.
