

We have had another busy half term in Reception!

World Book Day

We began by celebrating World Book Day - each class did lots of work about a different story and we all made some super art work to decorate our school library. We were also

able to tick off one of our 50 read books too!









Hoop Guy!

We were very lucky to have a hula-hoop lesson from the Britain's Got Talent semi-finalist: John Parnell aka Hoop Guy! He taught us lots of games and how to build a hoop den. We had lots of fun making our own hoop dens and learnt that collaborating as a team helped achieve the end result more efficiently.







Secret Garden

Our topic has been Secret Garden. We began by looking at different plants and seeds and discussing what things they needed to grow. We looked at the different parts of a plant, learning their names and what jobs they do.





After reading the story Oliver's Vegetables, we planted our own cress seeds. We watered them carefully and made sure they had plenty of sunlight. We then wrote our own instructions to explain what we did. We were very excited to take our cress home!







Science week

We carried out an experiment to see what happens when we put a flower into coloured water. Lots of children predicted that the flower would change colour because the stem of the flower will suck up the coloured water.

We were lucky to have a scientist visit school and he showed us how to make exploding rockets using diet lemonade and Mentos—it was very exciting!







Caterpillars

We had a special delivery of caterpillars this week. They are very tiny at the moment. They are in a special pot with food and we look forward to watching them grow over the next few weeks and hopefully turn into butterflies.

We have also been working hard on developing our writing skills with a focus on Paddington and his travels in London. All of our pupils in Year One have written their own Paddington story. We are impressed by the quality of the children's stories, including their structure, the super sentences with punctuation and description, as well as the children's stamina for writing. Naturally, we had to taste Paddington's favourite marmalade


sandwich...with mixed verdicts!



Over the course of the last six weeks, the children have also developed their knowledge and understanding of England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland through our topic work on the **British Isles**. Here is a glimpse of some of the activities that have kept us very busy...

We have been studying maps of the British Isles and the children are proud to have created their own maps. They have used a key to identify land and sea and labelled the countries with their capital cities and displayed each Countries flag on the map. At the very top of the map, the children have drawn a Union Jack to show the combination of the nation's flags. We have played a game involving collaboration, matching flowers to flags and countries.









Scotland and its islands...

For some of our work on Scotland we have taken inspiration from the stories written by Mairi Hedderwick about a little girl called Katie Morag who lives on a fictional Scottish Island called Struay. The children have been working hard to compare life in Hartshill to life on a Scottish island. They have been able to identify lots of similarities and differences in the way of life between the two.



To mark Saint Patrick's Day, we had our very own celebration in Year One! Dressed in green t-shirts for the afternoon, we discovered all about Saint Patrick and how he was a missionary in Ireland. We found out about Irish symbols and their meanings including the shamrock and the leprechaun. While we completed our activities, we enjoyed listening to some Irish music and had our own Irish Ceili! Some of our children were very good at dancing a jig and it caused us quite a giggle!





Republic of

Focus on Wales...Building on previous skills and learning, the children designed a poster on Book Creator detailing facts about Wales. They included information about sport, food, the Welsh language, mountains, rivers and the daffodil as the national flower of Wales. Super!



Focus on England, the country where we live...

We have been on a fact-finding mission to discover information about England. The children worked collaboratively to answer questions such as: What is the capital city of England? Where does the King live? What is England's most popular sport? Can you name some foods that England is famous for? Do you know the name of any famous English people? Through our Paddington stories, we have explored many landmarks in London such as The London Eye and The Tube, even travelling upon our own imaginary tour bus...



Stop, drop and roll was the order of the day when the fire service came to talk to us about fire prevention and keeping safe in the event of fire. The children were impeccably behaved and answered lets of questions demonstrating their maturity and The Fire Service Visit Nathaniel Newton! behaved and answered lots of questions, demonstrating their maturity and

understanding.



Hooray for World Book Day! The children celebrated WBD and loved dressing up as a book character and sharing their favourite books. We shared a very special assembly as a school and then each went back to our classes for a day of focused activities based on one book. Each class worked hard to produce a canvas and they are all on proud display in the library.



I hope you can see that children and staff have had a fabulous half term, and are really looking forward to the summer term and our upcoming topic "Knights, Castles and Dragons". We are going to open our new topic with a very special Dragon day... more details to follow.... It will also be lovely to enjoy the warmer weather and make opportunities to utilise our lovely outdoor space and play equipment. Year 2

Well this half term seems like it has flown by! The children in Year 2 have been incredibly busy working really hard in all areas of the curriculum. We are all very proud of the perseverant,

resilient learners they are!

Fabulous Flight

This half term our topic has been based on 'Flight'! As historians we have found out about the lives of significant individuals including the Wright Brothers and Amelia Earhart.







As part of our computing learning we have been creating our own algorithms. We used PurpleMash software on the computers to develop our coding skills before challenging ourselves to program a drone using the iPads!

All aboard Nathaniel Newton Airways!



To fully immerse ourselves in our topic we travelled to America on our very own airline! We made our own passports, had the full in flight experience including snacks and entertainment, and a full safety briefing from our cabin crew. We used our new knowledge to compare old and new planes, labelled key parts of the plane and even identified how planes have changed since the invention of 'The Wright Flyer' in 1903.

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English

This half term we have developed our stamina for writing. We have been working hard to write at length making sure that we use our writer's toolkit to help us write successfully. Our focus this half term has been on the books Emma Jane's Aeroplane by Katie Howarth and Amazing Grace by Mary Hoffman.


For both of the stories we have been using our prediction and inference skills to identify what we think the story will be about, looking at parts of pictures to help us come up with our own ideas. To share our ideas with others we drew our own story maps and bought our ideas to life through role











On World Book Day each class explored a book from our Year 2 '50 Reads' list. Each of the classes produced a wonderful canvas to represent the book we read together. Why not visit our newly refurbished library to see them in 'real life'! I'm sure you will agree they look AMAZING!









Maths

This half term we have been learning about shape and fractions. We have developed our understanding of the properties of 2D and 3D shape, sorting them using correct mathematical vocabulary to identify similarities and differences. Linked to this we have been identifying 1/2, 1/4, 3/4 and 1/3 of different 2D shapes and numbers.







The children have also been using the 4 operations: + - x and \div in the context of measures to apply their written methods of working out.

During the half term all children have experienced a wide variety of curriculum theme days and exiting activities from special visitors. This would not have been possible without your contributions so thank you very much for helping us to enrich the children's lives through first hand experiences.





To celebrate British Science Week the children took part in a day of hands on workshops to learn all about 'Connections'. We made prediction, were fascinated by scientific reactions and even got chance to make our very own slime!

The children had a fantastic experience with John 'The Hoop Guy'. We all tried so hard to learn how to hula hoop correctly, even the teachers had a go! We have to say though that the children were MUCH better than the adults!


