# All Creatures Great and Small by Year One

Year One have had a very busy and enjoyable half term. In our topic we have been learning all about creatures, yes, you guessed it, both GREAT and small! Ponds and Rivers, Pets, Minibeasts, Farm Animals and of course Zoo animals, we have explored a lot of different types of creatures. We have considered how to sort and classify animals—what makes a certain creature fit into a particular group of animals? Why is a dog suitable to be a pet but not a rhino? What are the names of farm animals and what is their purpose on the farm? We have learnt about animals and their young and the names of their young. We have considered the needs of pets and how domestic animals are cared for by their owners. We have explored the differences between herbivores, omnivores and carnivores and the definition of those words. It has been a very practical, hands on, active topic and one which has allowed us to make the most of our school grounds complete with pond, fields, shrubs and wooded area. Finally we took a trip to the zoo! Here are some of the activities that the children have completed......



The children made some textured animal pictures in art to complete our topic. They used different textures to create rubbings and then cut them to form a collage of a favourite zoo animal.



On our school field we are very fortunate to have a pond which is beautifully maintained. The children were able to head outside onto the field, complete with nets and trays and a "Pond life hunt sheet" to see what they could find. Our aim was to identify creatures that live in a river and/or a pond. Two newts were found by 1VH, along with a water snail, pond skaters and lots of pondweed by the other classes. We discussed what we might have found at other times of the year such as frogspawn...















# Minibeast Hunting

We combed the school grounds complete with magnifying glasses to search for minibeasts. We were curious to see what we could find and also the habitats of the minibeasts. Under logs, bark, stones, leaves, in bushes and trees we searched, hunting like detectives.









English: The Three Billy Goats Gruff was one of our focus text that began with a hunt for a very hungry troll...the children spotted a poster which read "Wanted: Greedy Troll" and so decided to take action and go searching in the school grounds. Unfortunately our search was futile. No troll was discovered but we did encounter three Billy Goats grazing in a field.....







#### School Gateway - An improved messaging system -

and you can help the school save money.

We are moving to SchoolComms as our platform for communicating with parents. A free smartphone app for parents is available for download called 'School Gateway' for Apple (iOS 8 on the iPhone 4S or later, iPad, iPod Touch) and Android (4.0 / Ice Cream Sandwich or later) devises.

Please could you download this new app to your phone (it's free) as it will help us improve communication with parents - and save the school money.

The set-up process is simple and will take no longer than a couple of minutes:

- 1. Search for "School Gateway" in the Apple App Store/Google Play or on your phone go to <a href="https://www.schoolgateway.com/apple">www.schoolgateway.com/apple</a> (Apple) or <a href="https://www.schoolgateway.com/android">www.schoolgateway.com/android</a> (Android).
- 2. Install the app and if you are asked then say yes to "Allow Push Notifications".
- 3. When you launch School Gateway for the first time, please select 'New User' and enter the email address and mobile telephone number you have registered with the school.
- 4. The system will send a PIN code to your phone; please enter this PIN code and the app will be activated for you. As soon as you've got the system set-up, all of the text messages we will send you will appear in the app; you'll receive notifications/alerts as normal.

If you have recently changed your email address or mobile telephone number, please let us know so we can update our records.

Leading animal welfare organisations have teamed up to produce a shareable infographic to encourage safe interactions with dogs.

#### Free Scooter Training - Summer Holidays

Warwickshire County Council and Warwickshire Road Safety Partners are offering free Scootability Level 1 training throughout Warwickshire during 7<sup>th</sup> - 11<sup>th</sup> August 2023. Training is suitable for children aged 5 – 10 years and is being held at the following locations:

- Monday 7<sup>th</sup> August: Long Itchington Community Centre, Long Itchington
- Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> August: Coleshill Memorial Park (basketball courts), Coleshill
- Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> August: Bailey Park, Bedworth
- Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> August: Newbold Comyn Leisure Centre, Leamington Spa
- Friday 11<sup>th</sup> August: GEC Car Park, Rugby

During the course, children will learn essential skills and knowledge to help them scoot safely, including:

- learning about the parts of the scooter and the safety gear
- · learning the basics of pushing, balancing and turning
- learning how to do slow and fast stops
- learning how to navigate stationary and moving obstacles
- learning how to do one handed signalling
- learning about road safety rules

All equipment, including scooters, helmets and pads, is provided. Booking is required and spaces are limited.


