

NATHANIEL NEWTON INFANT SCHOOL - PE and SCHOOL SPORTS PREMIUM

2022-2023

PE and School Sports Premium funding is paid to all schools with Primary aged pupils between Years 1-6. For us it means we receive additional funding for children in Year 1 and 2. Every school receives £16,000 plus an additional payment of £10 per pupil. Nathaniel Newton Infant School has received **£17,770** for the academic year September 2022 to July 2023.

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- Increased participation in competitive sport.
